Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take pursuant to an agreed order in case 5.042.19. In 2001, the applicant was found guilty of a misdemeanor. In 2018, the licensee falsified an endorsement RN application by failing to disclose the misdemeanor. The Board proposes to grant the application, but require the licensee to complete a remedial education course and pay an administrative penalty of \$500.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act authorizes the Board to “impose a corrective action” when a nurse “violates the act or a rule” promulgated by the Board. 59 O.S.Supp.2018, § 567.8a(A). The rules of the Board define unprofessional conduct to include “falsifying documents submitted to the Board[.]” OAC 485:10-11-1(b)(3)(E). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed action is necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State’s policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring that licensure applications are truthful and complete.
