Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take in case 6.041.19. The licensee failed to assist a combative resident, resulting in a shoulder injury to the resident. The licensee has requested to voluntarily surrender the license. The Board proposes to accept the surrender. Prior to reinstatement, the licensee will be required to complete remedial education courses and pay an administrative penalty of \$1,000. Upon reinstatement, the licensee must complete 1440 hours of supervised practice within two years.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act authorizes the Board to impose discipline when a nurse “fails to adequately care for patients or to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing” in a way that “unnecessarily exposes a patient or other person to risk of harm,” “is guilty of unprofessional conduct,” or “is guilty of any act that jeopardizes a patient’s life, health or safety.” 59 O.S.Supp.2018, § 567.8(B)(3), (7-8). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed actions are necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State’s policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring nurses meet minimum standards of professional conduct.
