INDICTMENT

FOR:

RECKLESSLY SELLING PRODUCTS USED AS PRECURSOR IN MANUFACTURE OF METHAMPHETAMINE in violation of Title 63 O.S. § 2-333(A) [Counts 1 through 4]

WILLFUL FAILURE TO REPORT INFORMATION TO THE OKLAHOMA BUREAU OF NARCOTICS in violation of Title 63 O.S. § 2-309C [Counts 5 through 7]

IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

By the order of the Supreme Court of Oklahoma, the Twelfth Multicounty Grand Jury was convened with its principal site to be in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, to serve from March 31, 2009, until September 30, 2010, or until the designated presiding judge determines the Twelfth Multicounty Grand Jury has reached reasonable completion of its investigations, but in any event, no more than twenty-four (24) months from the commencement of its term. That the said Multicounty Grand Jury of the State of Oklahoma, being composed of good and lawful men and woman, legally drawn and summons according to law and then and there examined, impeached, sworn and charged according to law to diligently inquire into and true presentment make of all public offenses against the State of Oklahoma committed and triable within the State of Oklahoma, upon their oath and in the name and by the authority of the

State of Oklahoma, do present and find that:

COUNT 1:

Commencing on or about the 12th day of September, 2008, A.D., through the 10th day of December, 2008, A.D., the crime of **RECKLESS DISTRIBUTION OF A PRECURSOR OF METHAMPHETAMINE** was feloniously committed in Comanche County, Oklahoma, by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** During all times set forth herein, and within said County and State, **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** who acting knowingly and intentionally distributed pseudoephedrine products with reckless disregard as to how the product will be used to wit:

Defendant engaged in a pattern of conduct resulting in a reckless disregard of his duty to maintain practices which guard against the diversion of pseudoephedrine from its legitimate uses into the manufacture of methamphetamine with full knowledge that sixty to seventy percent of pseudoephedrine sales were diverted to the manufacture of methamphetamine. Specific instances of misconduct include but are not limited to purchases of pseudoephedrine products to as many as five customers arriving in a single vehicle, entering Haskell's Pharmacy in a group, ordering the identical pseudoephedrine product, exiting the store together and departing in the same vehicle; individuals enter Haskell's pharmacy in a group, one customer inquires of another customer as to the specific pseudoephedrine product to be purchased; and recommending to an individual another product of lesser pseudoephedrine quantity when that individual has approached his maximum monthly allowance of pseudoephedrine products. Said acts by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** are contrary to the provisions of section 2-333 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

was unlawfully committed in Comanche County, Oklahoma by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** During all times set forth herein, and within said County and State, **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** acting knowingly and intentionally willfully failed to transmit information to the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics within thirty (30) days of dispensing Alprazolam a schedule IV narcotic.

The defendant **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** dispensed Alprazolam, a Schedule IV narcotic and willfully failed to transmit the either recipient's name, recipient's identification number, national drug code number of the substance dispensed, date of the dispensation, quantity of the substance dispensed, prescriber's United Drug Enforcement Agency registration number or the registration number of Haskell's Pharmacy. Said acts by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** are contrary to the provisions of section 2-309C of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

COUNT 6:

Commencing on the 29th day of January 2008 A.D. the crime of **WILLFUL FAILURE TO TRANSMIT INFORMATION TO THE OKLAHOMA BUREAU OF NARCOTICS** was unlawfully committed in Comanche County, Oklahoma by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** During all times set forth herein, and within said County and State, **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** acting knowingly and intentionally willfully failed to transmit information to the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics within thirty (30) days of dispensing Alprazolam a schedule IV narcotic.

The defendant **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** dispensed Alprazolam, a Schedule IV narcotic and willfully failed to transmit the either recipient's name, recipient's identification number, national drug code number of the substance dispensed, date of the dispensation, quantity of the substance dispensed, prescriber's United Drug Enforcement Agency registration number or the registration number of Haskell's Pharmacy. Said acts by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.**

are contrary to the provisions of section 2-309C of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

COUNT 7:

Commencing on the 11th day of January 2007 A.D. the crime of **WILLFUL FAILURE TO TRANSMIT INFORMATION TO THE OKLAHOMA BUREAU OF NARCOTICS** was unlawfully committed in Comanche County, Oklahoma by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** During all times set forth herein, and within said County and State, **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** acting knowingly and intentionally willfully failed to transmit information to the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics within thirty (30) days of dispensing Diazepam a schedule IV narcotic.

The defendant **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** dispensed Diazepam, a Schedule IV narcotic and willfully failed to transmit the either recipient's name, recipient's identification number, national drug code number of the substance dispensed, date of the dispensation, quantity of the substance dispensed, prescriber's United Drug Enforcement Agency registration number or the registration number of Haskell's Pharmacy. Said acts by **HASKELL LEE EVANS, JR.** are contrary to the provisions of section 2-309C of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

Counts 5-7: A violation of this section shall be a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term of not more than (1) year and a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by both such imprisonment or fine
