Purpose

In 2020, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted [House Bill 4138](#), the [Political Subdivisions Opioid Abatement Grants Act](#), creating the Oklahoma Opioid Abatement Board oversight body for the distribution of opioid settlement funds. [Section 2](#) of the Act provides the Legislature's purpose, which is "to promote and protect the health of Oklahomans by using monetary grants to abate the opioid crisis in a comprehensive manner that includes cooperation and collaboration with political subdivisions." [74 O.S.2021, § 30.4](#). All monetary grants provided by the Opioid Abatement Board shall be considered "opioid grant awards" as defined in [74 O.S.2021, § 30.5\(6\)](#).

Eligible Participants

The Act restricts grant applicants to the following: counties, incorporated municipalities, public school districts, career tech school districts, and a public trust solely benefiting any one of the above-mentioned subdivisions. Grant awards will be provided on an application basis. Applicants must demonstrate strong use of funds for abatement, need for funds, capacity for implementation, evidence base for proposed projects, and community partnership and support.

Because over 1,200 subdivisions are eligible to apply for an opioid grant award and limited funding is available, the Board has decided to require prospective applicants to notify the Board of their intent to seek an opioid grant award no later than [WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 25, 2023, AT 5:00 P.M.](#) No prospective applicant will be allowed to submit an opioid abatement grant application *unless* it timely submits a letter of intent.
