

ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINION 2017-808A

Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take pursuant to consent agreement in case 5.027.18. The licensee failed to remove a patient's old Scopolamine patch while administering a new one. The Board proposes to require the licensee to complete a remedial education course and pay a \$250 administrative penalty.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act authorizes "corrective action" when a nurse "fails to adequately care for patients or to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing" in a way that "unnecessarily exposes a patient or other person to risk of harm." 59 O.S.Supp.2017, §§ 567a(A), 567.8(B)(3). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed action is necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring nurses meet minimum standards of professional conduct.
