Dear Dr. Billy H. Stout, M.D., Board Secretary:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision intends to take pursuant to a consent agreement with physical therapist licensee PT 5422. The licensee is licensed in Colorado and has submitted an application for licensure in Oklahoma. The licensee currently has an agreed order with Colorado's State Physical Therapy Board for misconduct in that jurisdiction. The Board proposes to grant the application with conditions, which include requiring the licensee to follow all of the disciplinary sanctions in the Colorado order.

The Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act authorizes the Board to "establish rules authorizing the issuance of conditional, restricted, or otherwise circumscribed licenses, or issuance of licenses under terms of agreement . . . as [] necessary for the public health, safety, and welfare." 59 O.S.2011, § 493.3(D). The Board's rules state that the Board Secretary may enter into an agreement with an applicant when "circumstances and/or conditions of an applicant raise questions as to the fitness or ability of the applicant to practice medicine . . . with reasonable skill and safety or questions as to prior actions of the applicant in this or any other jurisdiction which would constitute a violation of the Act or [Board] rules." OAC 435:10-4-11(b)(2). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed action is necessary to protect public health.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy of protecting the health safety and well-being of the citizens of Oklahoma.
