

ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINION 2018-115A

Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take pursuant to a consent agreement in case 6.029.18. The licensee has previously been disciplined by the Board and is now before the Board for several events that involve the licensee's failure to provide adequate nursing care and therefore compromising vulnerable patients. The licensee has requested to voluntarily surrender the license. The Board proposes to accept the surrender. Prior to reinstatement, the licensee must complete two remedial education courses and pay an administrative penalty of \$1,000. Once reinstated, the licensee is to complete 1440 cumulative hours of supervised practice within two years.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act authorizes the Board to impose discipline when a nurse "fails to adequately care for patients or to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing" in a way that "unnecessarily exposes a patient or other person to risk of harm," "is guilty of unprofessional conduct," or "is guilty of any act that jeopardizes a patient's life, health or safety." 59 O.S.Supp.2017, § 567.8(B)(3), (7-8). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed actions are necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring nurses meet minimum standards of professional conduct.
