ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINION 2018-136A

Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take pursuant to a consent agreement in case 3.221.18. The licensee failed to document the administration and/or waste of controlled dangerous substance medications for three patients and subsequently displayed impaired behavior while on duty. The licensee has requested to voluntarily surrender the license. The Board proposes to accept the surrender for one year. Upon reinstatement, the license will be temporarily suspended pending the license will be revoked for two years and the licensee must meet Board guidelines for reinstatement. If reinstated after revocation, the license will be temporarily suspended and the licensee will be re-referred to PAP and will be required to pay an administrative penalty of \$2,000.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act authorizes the Board to impose discipline when a nurse "fails to adequately care for patients or to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing" in a way that "unnecessarily exposes a patient or other person to risk of harm," "is guilty of unprofessional conduct," or "is guilty of any act that jeopardizes a patient's life, health or safety." 59 O.S.Supp.2017, § 567.8(B)(3), (7-8). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed actions are necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring nurses meet minimum standards of professional conduct.
