## ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINION 2018-222A

Dear Executive Director Glazier:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing intends to take pursuant to a consent agreement in case 3.299.18. The licensee admitted to crossing professional boundaries with a resident. The Board proposes to temporarily suspend the license pending an evaluation, and prior to lifting the suspension, require the licensee to complete remedial education courses. Upon lifting the temporary suspension, the licensee will be required to complete 1440 supervised hours to be completed within two years and pay an administrative penalty of \$1,000.

The Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act authorizes the Board to impose discipline when a nurse "fails to adequately care for patients or to conform to the minimum standards of acceptable nursing" in a way that "unnecessarily exposes a patient or other person to risk of harm," "is guilty of unprofessional conduct," "[i]s guilty of any act that jeopardizes a patient's life, health or safety," "[f]ails to maintain professional boundaries with patients," or "[e]ngages in sexual misconduct . . . with a current or former patient." 59 O.S.Supp.2017, § 567.8(B)(3), (7-8), (12-13). The Board may reasonably believe that the proposed action is necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Board of Nursing has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring nurses meet minimum standards of professional conduct.
