Dear Executive Director Maile:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Oklahoma Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission intends to take pursuant to consent agreement with used motor vehicle dealer licensee UD-4800. The licensee was operating from an unlicensed location. The Commission proposes to fine the licensee \$1,000 per violation for a total fine of \$6,000.

Oklahoma law authorizes the Commission to fine a licensee for “willful[ly] fail[ing] to comply with any provision of Section 581 . . . or with any rule promulgated by the Commission,” or “[b]eing a used motor vehicle dealer who . . . is not operating from the address shown on the license.” 47 O.S.Supp.2018, § 584(A)(3), (7)(d). The Commission may reasonably believe that the proposed action is necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Oklahoma Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State’s policy of protecting the public by requiring that used motor vehicle dealers meet minimum requirements.
